Rosemary and Charles, two May graduates, offered to share their testimonies, and we hope you will enjoy what God is doing through His Son Jesus Christ in their lives here at Pacific Garden Mission.

Rosemary, a single mother of 9 children,

who after suffering from a severe illness that left her unable to work back in 2002, has been struggling with bouts of homelessness for well over a decade now. She is one of our recent graduates from the New Life Bible Program, and she shared part of her testimony with us.

## ROSEMARY'S Testimony

HAD MY UPS AND downs here at the mission, but overall it is truly a blessing. It is of the Lord's doing. Around the city there aren't places where you can get three meals a day, a shower, and a bed to sleep. Here at PGM, you hear the Word of God three or four times a day, which is very important because when you go out in the world you can forget if you don't hear it. When you come back into the mis-

sion and hear God's word again it is sweet, it is like sugar to your soul. When you hear the Word of God you can go a little further, but without God's Word you're just going to perish, you will crumble. With the Word you get strength day by day because it is spiritual food, it is life, it is God, it is Jesus."

While Rosemary initially came here to get her physical needs met, she found herself getting fed spiritually. Being an unwed mother of nine children, she faced what seemed like hurdles of Goliath proportions. Even though she didn't initially join our Program, she was slowly being fed, and the seed of change was being planted in her heart.

"God sent someone to witness to me, to tell me that God loved me, and that no matter what I was going through that He could help me. So I said OK, and I put my faith in Jesus. I said, 'Ok Lord, I am going to put everything and give everything to you. My kids I give to you, my life I give to you, I am going to let you work it out, Lord.' Jesus changed my life. He turned everything around. I didn't have a desire to live the way I was living because God had changed my heart, and He was telling me that He loved me, and that if I continued to trust Him things would get bet-

ter. Things have gone up and down, and it has not been smooth sailing. I have been going through some hills and some valleys, but the Lord has been taking me through all of it. God has been faithful and merciful with me."

Rosemary did end up joining the Women's New Life Bible Program and is excited about graduating. It has now been over a year since she joined, and since then she has been participating in GED classes, career development classes, and most importantly, Bible classes. For the first time in 15 years, Rosemary has a new foundation to build from, and not only the encouragement of the people around her here, but most importantly she has her faith in God.

"I praise God for this mission and I praise God for each person here. I praise Him for the Bible Program and that I had a desire to join the Bible Program so I could learn about Jesus. There is no one like the Lord. He loves me and I know that He suffered and died because He loved me so much. He could love even a nobody like me. I just want to learn more about Him and how to live right. He is a God of Love, pure love, holy, righteous."



## CHARLES'S STORY

HAD SPIRALED DOWN to a point where I was broken and hopeless. I was about to be homeless with nowhere to go. I was so depressed and broken that I contemplated suicide. At this point of desperation, the only words I could get out of my mouth were, 'God please help me.' I couldn't pay the TV cable bill so my cable went out; however, I figured out that putting tin foil around the end of the cable cord I would receive about 5 local channels. What would happen next was nothing less than a miracle.

I turned on the TV. One of the 5 local channels I received was WVCY channel 30, a Christian station in Milwaukee. The Pacific Garden Mission TV show happened to be on. I remember seeing the host of the show,

Stephen Welch, announce that miracles are happening every day at Pacific Garden Mission, and he was about to show some stories of hope. This caught my attention. I watched the first testimony of a woman about my same age who was college educated like I was. She was successful in her career and then lost everything like I had done. In addition, she broke trust with her children and family mem-

bers just as I had done. She then shared how the program at the mission had transformed her life. The show was keeping my interest and taking my mind off of what I was planning to do. After the testimonies, I watched Pastor Phil preach a powerful message and it seemed as if he had prepared his message that night specifically for me to hear; it convicted me, and I felt led by God to go seek him there.

My sister was kind enough to purchase a bus ticket for me. I arrived at the Pacific Garden Mission on April 4th, 2016. On April 5th I signed into the New Life Bible/ Discipleship Program. I met pastors and counselors who were committed to assisting everyone who entered the program to become fully functioning followers of Christ. I learned that the battles I had gone through had a biblical explanation and biblical solution. I was pursuing worldly fame and fortune. The desire to possess, the desire to impress people and the desire to indulge were my fleshly lusts. The bible says in 1 John 2:16: 'For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world.' My despair was being replaced with an appetite to learn more about the solutions rooted in the bible.

I started by working in the kitchen washing pots and pans and going to my New Life classes and bible studies. I was so broken; I was willing to do whatever they told me to do. After a few months, the fog began to clear and I was making good progress. I was moved from the kitchen into a position in Guest Services. I worked the 10 pm to 6 am shift on the front lines processing men and woman off of the street into the mission. I met men and woman from all walks of life with testimo-

nies that would leave most in astonishment. Many were hurting young people ages 18-22, lost and unwanted, many of whom were running from the war zone of the west side. It was here where I learned the heart of the mission services and how to put into practice what I was learning in the New Life program. The mercy and love of Jesus Christ, The Gospel message that can

transform a broken life like mine into a new creature in Christ. I was able to pray with those in despair. I was now sharing the fact that no matter how far down you are

or hopeless you may feel, Jesus knows and is here to bring a new life to those who believe. After working in Guest Services for several months, I was then promoted to work in Program Services. In this position, I was able to assist my brothers in Christ that joined the New Life Program. I also received the privilege of being able to preach the Gospel message on a regular basis to my brothers who are homeless in the day room.

In my final phase of the program, I was promoted one more time to work in the administrative offices' development department under one of my mentors, Stephen Welch. It is amazing to me that I get the opportunity to assist the PGM TV show that not only saved me but gave me a new life.

It's hard to believe a year has gone by as I graduate from the New Life program. By far

this program has been the most life-changing experience I could have hoped for. My appetite continues to increase for learning more about the Word of God, and I plan on continuing my studies within the field of apologetics. As Peter said in 1 Peter 3:15: 'But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear.'



## A Call to Be Men of God

The last book in the Old Testament ends with Malachi saying, "Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and dreadful day of the LORD: And he shall turn the heart of the fathers to the children, and the heart of the children to their fathers, lest I come and smite the earth

with a curse." (Malachi 4:5,6) To the people of that time faith was a mere formality; the religious leaders were interested in their own gain, and frequent divorce had broken apart the family unit. Most any man can father a child, but fewer can be a Dad. Biblically as well as statistically it has been observed that the reduction of Fathers in the home leads to more challenges for the child as well as a weakening of society. Secular studies observe, "Children who live without their fathers are more likely to engage in criminal behavior" (Horn & Sylvester, 2002), or "Commit a school crime—such as possessing, using, or distributing alcohol or drugs, possessing a weapon, or assaulting a teacher, administrator, or another student." (Jenkins, 1995).

The world has come to agree with what the Bible has always taught, that the role of the father is invaluable, and if absent the consequences will be devastating. "Now these are the commandments, the statutes, and the judgments, which the LORD your God commanded to teach you, that ye might do them in the land whither ye go to possess it: That thou mightest fear the LORD thy God, to keep all his stat-

utes and his commandments, which I command thee, thou, and thy son, and thy son's son, all the days of thy life; and that thy days may be prolonged. Hear therefore, O Israel, and observe to do it; that it may be well with thee, and that ye may increase mightily, as the LORD God of thy fathers hath promised thee, in the land that floweth with milk and honey." (Deuteronomy 6:1-3)

A young man here at PGM wrote the following note to me, "My Dad was never around to teach me and it's hard trying to teach myself something I don't know. But praise God for Pacific Garden Mission and the people He placed around me to show me what my family couldn't. I appreciate you Pastor Phil for taking me in with your everyday high fives and fist bumps, you have kept me in the notion that everything will get better soon." In Malachi's day, family reconciliation was needed no differently than in our own day. Men, let's not be just biological fathers but men of God that exercise our Godgiven calling.


