ing fornication. I had been saved for almost three years, but during that time I still was struggling with fornication. When I got saved, I expected everything just to change overnight, but I quickly found out it doesn't always change overnight. I would get frustrated and ask God why aren't things going right for me? My pastor would always tell me you have to come out of the fornication, and he would share the verse 2 Corinthians 6:17a: "Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate..." He would tell me that all of the time but I just didn't understand.

Our modern facility provides a safe environment to minister to both the spiritual as well as daily needs of the increasing number of women with children seeking our help. I was in a relationship for four years before I was saved, and after I was saved we were unequally yoked. There was a lot of fighting, and he did not respect me. It got to the point where I had nothing. All I had was Jesus. I would ask the Lord to help me leave because I didn't know how to leave. I didn't have the strength to do it. I would beg him and ask him all the time to help me. One day I got so tired I finally made the decision to leave, and that is what I did.

I didn't know where I was going. I didn't know what I was going to do. I didn't have any money or job. I went to one shelter, but I knew I couldn't handle it there. That night I was there I cried because I knew I wanted better and that my daughter deserved better. I was tempted to go back where I had left from, but I knew I couldn't. If I had gone back, nothing would ever change for me. I cried that night, and the Lord comforted me with his Spirit.

The next day my mom told me about Pacific Garden Mission and recommended that I come here. So we came here, and through staying here, I have come to know the Lord in such a different way. I have known His love, I have known His joy and how much

He cares for me, His peace, His mercy, His grace. Just everything. I always thought of God as just being this big entity in the sky waiting for someone to sin so He can cast them into hell, but when I got here and started to read about Him more and started to spend more time with Him,

I started to learn that He loves me. He cares about me so much, and He is so much different than what I thought He was.

At the same time, I felt like asking God, 'Why aren't you doing what I want you to do? I want a job. I want my own place. I don't want to be in a Rescue Mission.' I still had those thoughts. My pastor had taught us one time at church the verse Psalms 46:10a: "Be still, and know that I am God..." I asked God what does that mean? Do you want me to just sit here like a bump on a log?

Being here though I learned that what He meant was to seek Him first. Stop trying to do everything on my own and trust Him. We are so used to the world's way of doing things that we don't have the understanding that

God has. So I have been seeking Him for every little thing.

I had nothing, but He led me here to Pacific Garden Mission, where He gave me a bed, shower, food, clothes. Everything that I need, really, and I don't have to pay for any of it. I don't have to do anything but thank Him for it. I don't have to complain about why I am here because all things work together for good for those who love the Lord. He takes care of the birds and the grass, so how much more will He take care of us? I smile so much more because He has broken chains, He has destroyed yokes, He has taken me out of things that I never saw myself getting out of.

I am thankful for the people at Pacific Garden Mission and all the different classes we are invited to come to and to be able to talk to everyone where I can share with them and also learn from them. Without Him, I wouldn't have had the strength to stop forni-

# The Importance of Mothers

In 1928, and delivered to a Mother's Day audience, the Reverend W. L. Caldwell had this to say. "Well may we pause to pay honor to her who after Jesus Christ is God's best gift to men...mother.

It was she who shared her life with us when as yet our members were unformed. Into the valley of the shadow of death she walked that we might have the light of life. In her arms was the garner of our food and the soft couch for our repose. There we nestled in the hour of pain. There was the playground of our infant glee. Those same arms later became our refuge and stronghold. It was she who taught our baby feet to go and lifted us up over the rough places. Her blessed hands plied the needle by

day and by night to make our infant clothes. She put the book under our arm and started us off for school. But best of all, she taught our baby lips to lisp the name of Jesus and told us first the wondrous story of a Savior's love. The pride of America is its mothers. There are wicked mothers like Jezebel of old. There are unnatural mothers who sell their children into sin. There are sin-cursed, rum-soaked and abandoned mothers to whom their motherhood is the exposure of their shame. But I am glad to believe that there are comparatively few in this class." So said Mr. Caldwell.

That address was delivered in 1928, and sadly for some that is not their memory today. Some here at Pacific Garden Mission have a difficult time with Mother's Day. 23-year-old David writes, "I witnessed my mother almost overdose...she took all her pills attempting to kill herself. I saw her cut her veins...seen her trying to hang herself in the closet. She would drown herself in alcohol." 21-year-old Revon writes, "When I was eight years old my mom made me stand in a corner all night. To this day I still remember having child pro-

tective services take pictures of my bruised and scarred body. My mom used to not let me eat lunch or dinner." Carnell writes, "At the age of seven my mother lost her house, and we had to move into a shelter. My mother then became
