


# FEED MY SHEEP

## **EUGENE**

"What drove me here to Pacific Garden Mission was my addiction to alcohol. It came on late in my life—I was 50 years old. I'm not quite sure why it took that long to hit me because there is alcoholism in my family. But it hit . . . it hit hard and swept everything away.

"I built a 30-year career down at the Chicago Board of Trade, but technology pushed me out of there. As it did, I was questioning God about why this was happening to me. My children were building their own careers, and I was no longer married. I had a nice place to live and money in the bank . . . and that's when the devil entered my life through drinking. I felt I had been a humble



servant for many years, but I was suddenly lost. I didn't know what was next in my life, and I probably lost a little trust if I am totally honest. The drinking took away any aspirations and any dreams that I might have had as an older adult. I lost everything very quickly, and I have been trying to rebound ever since.

"I actually ended up in treatment, and then another treatment, and during those treatments, I heard about the Mission. My relationship with Christ was torn apart through the addiction, and after hearing about Pacific Garden Mission, I knew this had to be my place. I packed my bag and came to PGM with my addiction in tow. Within two weeks, God removed the mental obsession of drinking from me again, and that's still true today.

"I decided to complete the 90-day addictions recovery program and joined the one-year Bible program to become more intimate with God. His mercy directed me through PGM's New Day and

New Life programs, and I completed my studies this past September 2020. Graduation was not a completion but a true beginning in my walk in Christ. For now, I must apply His Word in all my affairs.

"These past months have been exciting as God continues to refine me with love and patience. Today, I am blessed, for I have been given the stewardship of a

PGM Guest Service employee, which allows me to grow closer to my loving God, assisting my fellow brothers daily in a dignified way in Christ. Through Christ and His mercy, my current 'day to day' is peaceful, and no matter the circumstance, Christ's mercy comforts me. I pray a simple nighttime prayer: 'God, send down one of your special angels to hold me and comfort me while I sleep in your peace.' And I sleep like a toddler. As I wake each day, I pray: 'God, send down one of your special angels to watch over me and keep me from harm—


especially from harm of self."

"One of my closest spiritual leaders here at the Mission said that Pacific Garden Mission is a church with a rescue mission dropped down in the middle—a church in which we practice reverence to the Lord (church) and respect to our guests (mission). Praise the Lord! Since I was a boy, I have known, through Christ,

that the greatest gift I can give another is my labor—which makes my stewardship to the Mission a love story!

"I love my Lord Jesus, and through his love for me, I extend all efforts toward our guests. I know now that I want to stand with the discarded and most vulnerable until others stop throwing them away. In the Holy Bible, Paul invites us to invest ourselves in others. Genesis 1:15 sums up my life here at PGM.

Eugene now assists the transient men in our dayroom with a humble servant's heart. He is able to help the lost and weary, and because he's often able to relate to their plight, he bonds with them and builds a connection of trust. Through this kinship, the Gospel message can be shared fruitfully. Because of you, Eugene was able to get the resources he needed here. And it's through your ongoing support that Eugene continues to grow in his relationship with Christ as he ministers to and serves others in need at the Mission. We thank you for making this Godly cycle of discipleship, healing, and love possible.




Hi!

I am always thrilled when former residents call or write back to tell me how they are doing.

I love what John says in 3 John: "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth."

I, too, have no greater joy than hearing stories of PGM's impact on so many lives. I recently received a note from a former resident. It reads, "I was a homeless resident in Pacific Garden Mission from 2-22-20 to 6-22-20. Thank you for housing, clothing, feeding, and sheltering me. I came to the ministry from NC without a winter coat and was the only vegetarian among the woman's group. Thank you for your ministry, the Word of God, and all the prayers I received from the staff. You are rendering a very important service to the city. I learned to sing the songs of Zion in circumstances. My favorite hymn was "More Love to Thee." Thank you for your love and dedication to Christ. I was

blessed by the overflow. You can count on my future support."

I asked former resident Theo to write about his experience: "My story begins in 2013, the year I joined the men's Bible program at the Pacific Garden Mission. I had been a former drug addict and had been living on the streets and in crack houses. I was in a hopeless state. I knew about PGM and felt like I had nowhere else to go. It was April 22, 2013, when I walked through the doors a broken man. The program introduced me to a Jesus I hadn't known before. Before, I struggled to find a bus card-but today, I have a car. Before, I lived in a crack house and on the street—but today. I have a comfortable home. Before, I had no one to share life with-but today, I have a wife . . . and even grandchildren! I have much to be grateful for today."

When I think of PGM, I don't think about the building. Rather, I think about the people who wander through our doors, find Christ, and see their lives changed. The transformation is truly my joy to see God's children walk in the truth.
