Mere words cannot convey the freedom and release that comes with a life surrendered to Christ. And it all starts with a decision made in faith.

"My life was very painful and I was always questioning God about why I suffered so much. Because I didn't understand my trials and tribulations my doubts towards God grew. When my guardian passed away, and 30 days later I lost my job, I reached a breaking point. It was on my birthday, I was all alone, and I was praying. That year I just prayed and prayed. I studied the Word and went to Church. but my heart just wasn't right. I was depressed and too prideful to ask for help; I was trying to fix myself, to make sure I was "OK", that I was "perfect" for someone else. My relationship with



God was just off.

When I came to Pacific Garden Mission, I came broken. I felt like I had nothing to lose. And like most people who come here, I was physically exhausted. I was also tired of not knowing and understanding God's plan for me. I met Pastor Phil, though, and he encouraged me to join the Bible Program. I said to myself 'What do I have to lose?' So, I went upstairs



and I started learning things about God I had never known. As I began understanding what my suffering and trials meant and grew closer to God, I knew I didn't want to leave here in the same way I came. I wanted to give Him the whole year in the Bible Program and that's what I did. I just focused on God

I set my intentions to graduate the Bible Program and also to help others while I was here. I became a serving leader in our dorm, helping newly-arrived women stay focused on God.

When I got to the career development phase of the Bible program, I decided to go back to school to learn to be a pharmacy technician. God opened up that door and I went back to school and graduated. I recently got a job working at a pharmacy. I am now moving forward and I can

testify to God. I went through the day room and the Bible program, and I can tell you it was not easy. And I can also tell you that if you trust in God and walk with Him in your journey, He will be right there with you. Jesus says, "But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you" (Matthew 6:33). I know now that if I stick with that and trust in His word He is faithful to fulfill it. Take the time and steps to give yourself up to God and He will transform you."

Ayonda graduated the Bible program, finished her schooling, and is currently employed at a pharmacy. As Christians, we measure success differently than the rest of the material world. At Pacific Garden Mission, we strive towards Godly

PGM: A LIGHT IN A DARK CITY

Pacific Garden Mission is in the heart of a dark city. Murder, crime, gangs, and many other vices often make national news. As the people of God, we are told, "that ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world; Holding forth the word of life;..." (Philippians 2:15-16). For over 141 years, we have been guided by the life-changing gospel message that shines at the front of our Mission and declares; "Jesus Saves."

We must shine with this message brighter than ever before as we continue to face and meet the ever-growing challenges our city presents.

Recently, when temperatures plunged to -24 and life on the streets was simply unbearable, I recalled the circumstances of the early church in Rome. The church stood out in that time and place because of their response to human suffering and commitment to their Savior. History

tells us: "When a devastating plague swept across the ancient world in the third century, Christians were the only ones who cared for the sick, which they did at the risk of contracting the plague themselves. Meanwhile, pagans were throwing infected members of their own families into the streets even before they died, in order to protect themselves from the disease." During this recent cold snap, we welcomed any and all that could walk through our doors. I opened the door for an elderly lady who came in from the cold with a walker. Imagine being on the streets with no family while dealing with a disability that requires maneuvering a walker through the snow in frigid temperatures. I want to thank you for helping us make sure she had a warm place to sleep.

Thank you for helping to make it possible that she had a warm place to find refuge in. Your support also

allowed us to take in even more residents from another shelter in the city after their pipes burst from the cold.

Thank you for your support, and continue to pray for us as we truly shine as lights in a dark world.

As we draw nearer to closing out 2018, I am again confronted with the incredible support and faith from our Pacific Garden Mission community, of which you are an integral member. I also remain eternally grateful to God for your consistent dedication to our community's homeless, and I hope you will continue to prayerfully ask Him in what ways we can move forward in serving His people together in all stages of their faith journeys.

Additionally, we at PGM have been working hard to keep down our administrative costs so that we can dedicate as many resources as possible to those we serve. I am happy to report these encouraging updates:

Our mortgage balance as of January 31 is \$3,361,601.07.

Our Principle Paydown in 2018 was \$191,891.80—thank you to everyone involved in helping us reduce our debt!

Our Water Bill is also down by more than \$129,601.54!
