


"PGM: A SPIRITUAL HOSPITAL"

"Growing up, I was one of the only girls, so, I did a lot of the stuff boys did. I had a mom and a dad, which I am grateful for, but I felt like I was alone much of the time and even though I was around a lot of people I still felt isolated and misunderstood. I started looking for relationships with guys as a way to fill the emptiness I felt.

"Trying to get relief from the loneliness I started wanting to find someone that I could eventually get married to and live life together.
Unfortunately, I seemed to look for love in all the wrong places. I went through a lot of trials because of this,



and the emptiness was never filled with anything sustaining. I ended up getting tired of the fruitless searching and all the silly stuff, and at the same time there began a desire within me to seek the Lord.

"I started to read a Bible that my cousin had left at my house and soon after I started looking for a church home. I found a church home, and I have been seeking God ever since. I did well for a while, but I lacked an intimate relationship with God. The church I had been attending before coming to Pacific Garden Mission had not taught me about salvation and Jesus dying on the cross for us. My church hadn't taught that part of Christianity. I began to drift away again back into sin. My mother knew I loved God and that I wanted a better life for myself and seeing me struggling through certain life events she suggested I come to PGM. I believe the Lord wanted me to come here.

"I have been at PGM now for almost a year, and I enjoy living here.

My relationship with God is more stable now, and especially since I came to Pacific Garden Mission I have been able to focus on Him more. Before I surrendered my life to God I had been entrapped by sexual immorality, and it had gotten horrible. Even though I had a nice job I still felt like a failure. I felt hopeless, and I was

"When I gave my life to God and received Jesus as my Savior it was like a weight lifted off of my chest. Being here has helped me to grow to know Him and trust Him more. I know it's about a relationship with Him now. Being at Pacific Garden Mission I have learned what Christ did for me and that I can never lose my salvation. My mother is starting to trust me and our relationship is growing closer with each passing day.

"One of my favorite Bible verses is Romans 8:28: 'And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.' I know that even though I have made

some crazy decisions in the past God knows my heart, and He knows I love Him. I am focused on Jesus, and I now know everything works out for the good for those that love Him. If you trust in Him, He will have a path for you that will be great. Even if you have backslidden just turn back to Him, and He will be there for you."

Like Keyonnie, many of those that have joined our Bible Programs are looking to renew their relationship with Jesus Christ. A Word from Philip Kwiatkowski President, Pacific Garden Mission

"PLEASE, REACH OUT TO THE POOR."

Only they would that we should remember the poor; the same which I also was forward to do. — Galatians 2:10 KJV

When I think of remembering the poor, I think of what you make possible every day at Pacific Garden Mission. Recently a 65-year-old man came and inquired about a visit to the hospital. I noticed that the skin on the top of his head was stapled together. I asked what happened and he stated that he was standing on a bus stop and someone randomly came by and started shooting. A bullet grazed his scalp, and another one hit him under the ear.

We helped transport him for his appointment, but I thought if that were me, I would be surrounded by family, inundated with well-wishers, and cared for by my wife. As I observe this man there are no well-wishers or cards. He is forced to deal with this horrific situation all alone. I have made it a point to go out of my way and see him and ask about his well being, and just last week he came up and thanked me for being so nice to him. I thought my gestures were small but that is all he had, and it meant something.

Another man that I have known was gone for a period of time. When I saw him I asked where he has been. Since he has been confined to a motorized wheelchair, his absence from the Mission was noticeable. He said that some young kids took him to an ally, threw him out of his wheelchair, and stomped him, breaking some ribs, all in an attempt to rob him. He was in the hospital and now he is back. PGM is the only family he has.

My heart breaks for the pain, but praise God, the poor have a place full of the love of Jesus where they can find comfort and hope. I was thrilled when recently one of our overnight guests approached me in the hallway to say goodbye. Ms. Buchanan came here two years ago out of a desperate situation with nowhere to go. While here, she grew in the Lord, found employment, and put the pieces of her life back together. She told me she was getting the keys to her apartment that day and was thanking PGM for all that they did in seeing her return to society as a fully functioning follower of Christ.

This kind of life transformation is what we pray for all the men and women God brings to us.

Thank you for helping to make this ministry possible. And remember the words of Paul, in Galatians 2:10: "Only they would that we should remember the poor; the same which I also was forward to do."
