"I came to Pacific Garden Mission because my life was very unstable. The ups and downs were too much for me to handle alone. When I was only four years old, my mother died of a brain tumor, and for a time my family was broken apart until my father remarried. These events carried with me and weighed me down as I grew. Later in life, I found myself at a breaking point, losing my job and then also losing both my father and step mother within the same year. On top of that, my marriage of 18 years was failing. I needed a change. That is what brought me through the doors of



PGM. I needed something to hold onto, some strength, and that's what I found at Pacific Garden Mission.

"Initially, I had required somewhere to sleep, and I was sent to the Pacific Garden Mission by another shelter that had run out of beds. The shelter where I had been previously only had eight women and 90 men, and when I arrived at PGM, there were over 200 women and many more men. When I got here, the only possessions I owned were a backpack with a pair of ieans in it. The staff at PGM made sure that I got all the necessities I needed including clothing, toiletries, a shower, a bed to sleep in, and three meals a day. The first night I was in the PGM chapel I heard

given by Pastor Percy (a graduate of the New Life Program) and that is when I decided to turn my life over to Jesus Christ.

"The New Life program has been wonderful and has many counselors you can go to for advice and mentoring. Pastor Phil had encouraged me to go into the program and thought it would be good for my spirit. Learning more about the Bible and

getting closer to God has been very helpful, especially with what I have gone through, including the early death of my mother. I am working on reuniting with my family now. I had lost contact with my two sons and am currently working on rebuilding our bonds.

"I recently was moved to
the Unshackled! department to
work, and I am enjoying the
ministry. We have a lending
library for the blind where
we mail out recorded
Unshackled! testimonies. I
help to send out orders
and find it rewarding. I am
very grateful for what I
have here. I get the Word
of God three or four times a day.

"One of my favorite Bible verses is 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18: 'Rejoice evermore. Pray without ceasing. In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you.' That is one of the greatest things I have learned here, is to pray without ceasing. Before, when I was going through my ups and downs, I was

praying unconsciously. Looking back, I can see that now. I had been praying in my own way back then and now."

Lori now has a second family of support and encouragement here at PGM. She attends daily Bible classes and devotions and is in a place of safety and stability. A person can have very little and feel more at peace than

ever. The peace of Christ words fail to convey, but the Gospel leads the lost to that peace. As God provides the spiritual peace, PGM provides young disciples of Christ every necessity, providing a sanctuary of study, prayer, contemplation, and healing. A Word from Philip Kwiatkowski President, Pacific Garden Mission

WE HAVE A MESSAGE OF HOPE

The righteous considereth the cause of the poor: but the wicked regardeth not to know it.

Proverbs 29:7

As I listen to the stories of the men and women on the streets, it makes me stop and consider what I can do to help. I was in our day room, and an elderly man approached me asking for bus fare to go to a doctor appointment. I noticed that he had a head injury, so I asked him what happened. He stated that he was shot in the head while standing at a bus stop. The bullet grazed his head, and one struck him in the back of the ear. He is now recovering but dealing with the emotional aftermath.

Another man walked up and said that he went into cardiac arrest last Friday and actually died for a period of time but was revived. After telling me, he walked back to his seat and blended in with the rest. Last week another man asked me a question. He stated that he hears a lot about forgiveness, but he's struggling with this topic. He told me his daughter was raped and beaten for nine years, and her mother allowed this. "I am full of anger and hate," he said. "What do I do?"

Along the back wall, a man was sitting in a wheelchair because his leg had been amputated. I asked him what happened, so he said that he fell out of a third-floor window while drunk and lost his leg. Another man is undergoing treatment for throat cancer; he has no family or friends to ask him of his well being or support him through his treatment. He has lost most of his hair but continues his regular treatment. He sits in our day room blending in with the others, not knowing if he will even live.

It is easy for the individual to get lost in the sea of the masses of people that walk through our doors, but it the individual that we serve. We have a message of hope, love, and yes, forgiveness that is transforming lives just like these, and I want to thank you for your giving, and for the way you are considering the cause of the poor.
