

# "I KNEW PGM WAS WHERE I NEEDED TO BE"


George Easton, a resident of Chicago, shares about his 16-month journey of transformation at Pacific Garden Mission. While his roots were firmly grounded in a Godly upbringing, he strayed into the darkness, enticed by the allure of material possessions and a misguided sense of belonging. This is the story of how he found his way back, guided by the unwavering grace of God and the support of the incredible individuals at Pacific Garden Mission.

### **GEORGE**

"My name is George Easton, and I was born and raised in Chicago. I

was brought up in the Word but chose to go down the wrong path. As a kid, I would sit down with my mother and father and have Bible studies. I went astray with the wrong crowd, which took me through a dark phase of my life.

"I had uncles who were out there on the streets, hustling and living for Satan, doing ungodly things. They tended to get me out of all my brothers and sisters, and I liked being around them because of the things they had, like the cars, money, and nice jewelry. I had a lot of knowledge of both the Godly and wicked sides from a young age. I chose more of the wicked side and



am just thankful God didn't give up on me.


"What brought me to PGM is my marriage fell apart. I knew about Pacific Garden Mission because I had been here before. It is an excellent place to be if you are serious about getting your life together. I didn't want to be around any of my family members and just wanted to start fresh and get lined back up with the Lord. I knew PGM was the place to come because of

Pastor Phil, Pastor Green, and other employees I know.

puzzled by how Jesus, His Son, suffered and died for us. For Him to give His only begotten Son for sinners is just so powerful to me. I could never get that out of my mind or spirit.

"At Pacific Garden Mission they have the Bible program, and that is the program I chose. They have teachings about the Gospel and what the Gospel is. The teachers truly care, and that is the main thing. The Mission has rules and regulations to keep order. I had a problem with that, but

once God started working on me and the people at the Mission started helping me look at myself, my life began to fall in order. I truly thank God for His grace and mercy because none of us would be here without it. I went through the Bible program and graduated in May of last year.

"Then, I went through orientation for the maintenance job, which I have been working for about nine months. Since I got lined up with the Lord, when I spend time with my family and grandkids, I try to instill the Word in them. A lot of times on Sunday, we all go to church."

Through trials and tribulations, the Mission became a sanctuary where George discovered the teachings of the Bible, embraced the Gospel, and learned to appreciate the profound sacrifice of Jesus. The Mission's rules, initially challenging, became a framework for order in his life, thanks to the transformative power of God's grace.

George stands not only as a



testament to God's mercy but as proof that Pacific Garden Mission is a haven for those seeking solace, redemption, and a genuine connection with God. It's not merely a shelter; it's a church-based program that addresses diverse struggles, providing love, guidance, and a supportive community. The scourge of drugs has been devastating to those who dabble in its superficial enticements. I spoke to a 27-year-old man yesterday who recently overdosed and came to find out he has had many overdoses. As he sat there, I thought, this is someone's son, and his life is already in jeopardy at his young age. This incident made me praise God for our New Day recovery program, where many are being set free from the clutches of addiction. This young man was offered the opportunity to join, and I hope he does and finds freedom from his addiction through faith in Christ.

I asked some of our clients in the program to share what life was like during their addiction and what life is like now. Here is a sample:

"My life was in a perpetual state of

"(For the weapons of our warfare are hopelessness. Suicidal ideas ran rampant constantly in my mind. Addiction robbed me of my fervor for life and my ambition to pursue happiness. My mind is being renewed now that I am not poisoning it with toxins. I was reminded that I was designed for a specific purpose, which is to glorify God. I'm at peace with the fact that booze and drugs just don't work for me if I want to reach my full potential. The fog is clearing up."

> Another writes, "My life was a mess, my relationship with my family was failing, my health was poor, I was lost in my madness, I was tired of being sick and tired." Now she says, "By the grace of God I am saved. I can see now that I needed help . . . I am in my right mind and can restore the relationship with my family . . . I am so grateful for the New Day women's treatment program."

> This is just a small sample of the number of lives being changed by Jesus through this amazing ministry.

> Thank you for your love, prayer, and support for this crucial, lifechanging ministry. Overdoses continue to happen, but we have an answer, and that answer is Jesus.

This donated food is deliciously prepared by our exceptional food service team, overseen by Executive Chef Erika Webb.

Food donations profoundly benefit the Mission and our guests' lives.

#### **Message of Care and Support**

Food donations not only fill stomachs

but also warm hearts. They help the Mission provide a powerful example of the love and compassion of Jesus Christ to those experiencing homelessness, reminding them that they are not forgotten or alone.

#### **Financial Benefit**

The value of food donated to the Mission is estimated to be \$2 million annually. This enables us to allocate more resources to our transformative addiction recovery and spiritual growth programs.

Even though food donations from our gracious suppliers provide much of the food we need, there are times when PGM needs to purchase food items. And staffing our food service operations also goes into the cost of providing a healthy menu.
