RESCUED FROM THE COLD RESTORED BY JESUS CHRIST

As the bitter winds of February sweep through Chicago, countless men and women are left searching for warmth, safety, and hope. For Yohance, the cold became a crossroads. Shivering on the streets and sleeping on train cars, he finally reached the doors of Pacific Garden Mission tired, broken, and ready for change. What began as a desperate search for shelter on a freezing night became the start of something far greater. Inside our doors, Yohance found more than a warm bed and a meal; he found a new life and a restored relationship with Jesus Christ.

YOHANCE'S STORY


"My name is Yohance Crigler. I was born in Detroit, Michigan. Growing up, I came from a middle-class family and thought I had a basically good life. However, there was a lot of influence from drugs and the inner city in my neighborhood in Detroit, and I fell victim to that. I began drinking alcohol and smoking marijuana at the age of 19. I thought my life was okay during that time. Later, I moved to Chicago where I ended up using other drugs and getting involved in crime. I was just trying to find a program that worked for me while going in and out of jail, homeless shelters, and treatment centers.

Hitting Rock Bottom

"My whole life was based purely on willpower, drinking every day, trying to maintain work and function, but really just stuck in place. I was lost, going to work, coming home, and drinking again, not eating. One day, I just gave up. I walked away from my family and everything I had. I spent several nights sleeping on the Chicago trains, both homeless and cold. They were sleepless, hungry nights, surrounded by people using drugs and drinking all night long. I realized I had become a slave to everything outside of me, including alcohol, cigarettes, and drugs. I was exhausted.

"One day, I finally made it to Pacific Garden Mission. It was February 17th. I'll never forget that date. I entered the New Day program, graduated in May, and

since then, I've had a new lease on life. I was lost all that time and never realized it until I gave my life to Jesus Christ.

A New Life in Christ

“Since being here, I've had new experiences. This program has been a great blessing, and I am grateful to God for it. I plan to complete the Bible program and am currently about a quarter of the way through. This program saved my life. I didn't realize how far I was from God until now.

“My job assignment here is in Ministry Services, where I assist other men in joining the program.



I'm also the barber here, giving haircuts to the new men coming in. Redefining their appearance and helping them see the change in themselves has been rewarding. I've seen men come into the program after 20 or 30 years of addiction and watching their transformation has been powerful.

Learning to Trust God

“One thing I've learned is that I can't trust my own thinking. My thoughts aren't always accurate if they're not aligned with God's principles. I've learned to take suggestions from people who have gone through this process.

 If it's not driven by God, it leads in the wrong direction. I always knew about God and the Bible, but I never had a personal relationship with Him.

“I carried a lot of shame and guilt from using drugs, drinking, and leaving my family.

“For ye are born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever” —1 Peter 1:23 KJV

But now I'm learning that I don't need to keep beating myself up. If I continue to focus on Christ and the good things He's equipped me with, I'll be okay. I can't go back to the old person I was. I don't want that old life back. This is a whole new life and a whole new me.”

This February, while the city remains gripped by cold and danger, Pacific Garden Mission continues to offer warmth and transformation to those who have nowhere else to turn. Yohance's story reminds us that behind every guest who walks through our doors is a heart searching for hope, and that hope begins here. Through the compassion of faithful supporters like you, people are not only given refuge from the freezing streets but are introduced to the life-changing love of Jesus Christ.

“WHERE WOULD YOU BE?”

The winters in Chicago can be some of the most difficult times for those on the street. I asked a number of our overnight guests what it means to have a safe, warm place to stay during the winter. Also, I asked where they would be if PGM were not here?

One man says, “*It means a lot that while I’m dealing with my medical stuff to not have the worries or fears of a safe place to sleep or a warm meal. I had nowhere to go with my current situation being in a wheelchair, let’s just say I have immense gratitude for being let in here.*” **Another says,** “*I would be in jail if it were not for PGM.*” **Someone else writes,** “*To be able to be physically inside and not getting hypothermia. I would be dead.*”

One writes, “*It means that a person won’t have to brave the elements of winter. Toes and fingers are at risk of frostbite and amputation.*” **Yet another man says,** “*Staying under a bridge.*”

Winter is not just a bitter inconvenience but a matter of life and death for them. God has kept these doors open since 1877 as a lighthouse to those in desperate need and once inside and safe, they can hear the life-changing message of Jesus Christ. Think about what we were told. Without PGM: death, jail, or living under a bridge. I thank our Lord for His kindness and you for your love, prayer, and support. This winter, let’s remember those who have so much less but are so thankful just to walk through these doors.

39,276 plates of food were served (est.)


